#### **ARTS PROGRAM UPDATE**

#### **Growth & Innovation**

In 2024, ECAT's Teen Arts Program saw record participation, driven by a new open studio model. This youth-led approach lets teens choose instructors, artistic mediums, and projects, fostering creativity, problem-solving, and a strong sense of independence.

#### **CLINICAL MEDICAL ASSISTANT PROGRAM UPDATE**

#### **Key Achievements**

In 2024, the Clinical Medical Assistant (CMA) program focused on empowering students to secure gainful employment with self-sustaining wages in careers that directly support the Erie community. Through hands-on training and a focus on both technical skills and professional development, students were equipped to make a meaningful impact in the healthcare field.



#### **Student Growth & Success Stories**

Under the expert guidance of Ms. Danielle, our dedicated Medical Instructor, students learned that success as a Clinical Medical Assistant requires more than just knowledge—it demands professionalism. One standout student, Tamya, exemplified this growth. Throughout her time in the program, Tamya honed her professionalism, leading to glowing feedback during her externship. ### **Challenges & Looking Ahead:**

One of the ongoing challenges in 2024 was addressing mental health concerns that impacted student success. Recognizing this need, we continue to strengthen partnerships with local behavioral health agencies to ensure students have access to the support they need. By fostering these community connections, ECAT remains committed to helping students overcome barriers and achieve long-term career success.


#### CONSTRUCTION TRADES PROGRAM UPDATE

#### **Key Achievements & Highlights**

In 2024, the Construction Trades training program provided valuable hands-on skills and real-world experience at both the Erie Center for Arts & Technology and Erie High locations. The first cohort received 75 applications, enrolled 22 students, and graduated 13. The second cohort, which began in September, saw an overwhelming response with nearly 185 applications. Recognizing the growing demand for the program and the need for more resources and staff support, we made the decision to move all classes to our facility and increase enrollment, allowing us to accept 35 students.

#### **Challenges & Lessons Learned**

As Erie Center for Arts & Technology continues to grow, the focus remains on aligning training with both industry demands and community needs. The key to long-term success is listening to students and partners, ensuring that the program evolves to meet the changing landscape of skilled trades and workforce development.











Our goal is to create a training environment where students don't just learn a trade—they gain the confidence and hands-on experience needed to build real careers. Seeing our students thrive in these community projects is the best reward.







# 2024 Highlights



# **Food Program**

ECAT piloted a food initiative for our Teen Arts Club, providing nutritious meals during our Spring and Fall sessions. This program addresses food insecurities that are prevalent in our low-income neighborhood, while introducing students to new cuisines and fostering creativity around food.

#### **Launched Freedom House**

Freedom House is a 6-week program presented in partnership with UPMC and is designed to provide an introduction to a variety of available career paths in the growing healthcare industry. Students have the opportunity to job shadow, connect with professional mentors, and learn about the basics of providing compassionate care, while working towards employment opportunities in the healthcare industry.





# **OJT Training**

In partnership with BUILD CDC, Erie Center for Arts & Technology expanded our Construction Trades training with an On-the-Job Training (OJT) Program providing students with real-world experience on meaningful community projects, while connecting them with local employers. Students worked on projects for ERIE BANK, Greater Erie Area Habitat for Humanity, Sisters of St. Joseph Neighborhood Network, and Our West Bayfront (OWB), reinforcing their skills while making a tangible difference in the local community.

#### **Arts Career Mural**

ECAT'S Teen Arts Career students collaborated with our teaching artists and EMTA staff to design a mural that celebrates EMTA throughout time. The result? An out-of-this-world design that features a space bus to tomorrow!
